INFORMATION SHEET FOR RESCUE CENTRES

As a breed club for Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retrievers (Tollers) we are very concerned that some of our breed are in rescue centres around the country, and perhaps not being identified correctly.

Our club runs a fully funded breed specific rescue program that specialises in the housing, assessing, rehabilitation and re-homing of this very unique breed. Hopefully the information in this leaflet along with the photographs of the different types of Toller you may come across will help with any future identification of the breed.

The Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever is a medium sized dog with a feathered tail. Usually orange or red and often with white markings on head, feet, chest and tail tip. Less common is a Buff coloured dog. They have webbed feet and a unique 'scream' when excited, although not all Tollers do this. Nose and pigment is black or flesh coloured.

Here are some photos to show you the diversity within the breed, which is often mistaken for a 'collie cross' or 'retriever cross' These are all purebred Tollers.
